JRDA meeting minutes

August 5, 2017

Pocahontas State Park

- Breakfast was served prior to calling the meeting to order.
- The meeting was called to order at 9:05 by President Daphne Wood-Lasser
- 5 New Members present were introduced at the meeting, (Debb Pyle, Don Madigan, Cathy Booth, Samantha Slopey and Elizabeth Slopey)
- Treasurer's Reports for the previous 2 meetings were reviewed and approved. Current balance \$5,681.05
- Minutes from the past meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Old Business

1. Final results from our ADT - Candy reported that we came ahead approximately \$300. It was noted that there was no ADS grant funding for this event either.
2. Update on Driving Rally October 7th – Shirley reported that the registration forms are on the website and everything is on schedule
3. 2018 Winter Seminar – The group by majority show of hands responded that they would like to see the Winter Seminar again in early 2018.
4. 2018 ADT Planning Committee reported that planning for May 19th is underway and if others wish to join the committee to contact either Lynn or Daphne.
5. The Club voted to create and sell club stickers that can be placed on vehicles with the change that they would prefer to have the circular one with the James River Driving Association LOGO. Using JRDA might be confusing as when those initials are Googled – you get Junior Roller Derby Association☺.

New Business

1. Purchase of materials and construction of 8 hazards to be maintained at MEP- Motion was made to allocate \$500.00 towards the purchase of materials. Motion passed by a show of hands. Karin Sclater offered to provide an alternate pattern for hazards to be considered.
2. Will need volunteers for assembly and transport to MEP for storage unless they are constructed at MEP. Several volunteer names were collected. A date later this year to be selected for the workday.
3. Elections for next year's officers @ November 10th meeting. Members were asked to contact the Nominating Committee (Tom Lasser 804-798-8787) to nominate officers. Meeting to be held at the Ashland Rescue Squad, November 10th.
4. Club agreed to sell remaining 2017 calendars for \$5? – Contact Shirley Cauley and she will get them to you.
5. Club agreed to creating a 2018 Calendar – Sarah Vogeley has volunteered to handle the printing details so send your high quality, high resolution photos to her. Selections will be voted on from entries (either sent to Sarah or brought to the meeting) at our November 10 meeting. Photos must be of high enough quality for printing to work. If not, they may not be able to be included even if they are selected.
6. Proposal for Quarterly Club meetings (featuring a program/speaker). It was pointed out that this had been voted on at an earlier meeting but was not formally adopted. It was decided to review the bylaws for clarity on exactly what needed to be modified. Look for further bylaw details in the next newsletter.

7. Additionally, with the change to quarterly meetings – modifying the newsletter publication to quarterly is also to be considered. The intention of the change is to make life easier for the few individuals that faithfully carry out the business of the club on an ongoing basis. This includes our officers and our newsletter editor who devote time each month to preparing for meetings and publishing the newsletters.
8. Paula Bliss clinic update given by Daphne – registration is now open and have begun receiving entries.
9. It was suggested to modify clinic offerings when open to public that we provide a closing date for club members first and then non-members. No action taken at this point.
10. New member Debb Pyle who has a farm in Fluvanna has offered her farm as a potential venue for holding pleasure drives or Driving Derbies. The suggestion was well received as it is a more western located venue that would be a nice change for club members coming from west of Richmond for events. Daphne will schedule a visit to check out the location – possibly a short drive. Let Daphne know if you are interested in going.

Member Profile of the Month: September: Mary Phelps, Rapidan, VA, Columbia, KY and Ocala Florida.

Owner, HorsesDaily.com - Equine Insurance and farm insurance agent with Markel Corp, Glen Allen, VA

What was your first experience with driving? How were you introduced to it? How long have you been driving?

Driving has somehow always been in my life from a horse crazy kid living in a non horsey family in suburbia. I still remember driving in a girlfriend's pony carriage through the woods in Milton, Mass when I was in Junior High. Then I cleaned stalls for a wonderful man, Martin Wifholm who collected and restored carriages. He had a horse drawn bookmobile he had found in a barn and we drove it in the bi-centennial parade. In my early 30's I worked for 2 winters with Standardbreds in Pompano Park, for Harness Racing Hall of Famer, Billy Haughton. It was there I met an old timer Horse photographer and began my career in media and marketing doing images and training reports. That led to the insurance business which I have been doing over 30 years. I got my first pony in 2005. I have had the Gangsters now for 4 years.

Do you participate, or have you participated, in any other equine disciplines?

Not as a rider since Pony Club, but have been covering mostly dressage shows since 1980 as a photographer for riders and magazines - the idea was it would support owning a horse but then when I finally got one I had no time for her. Ironically her name was Candid Camera. It was sometime in the 1980's I covered a driving event at Gladstone and I was hooked. Somehow, someday, some way I would do this sport. I am a long time member of the IAEJ - The International Alliance of Equestrian Journalists covering major international events such as the World Championships, Olympics, and Aachen. What I have learned watching the best of the best in all disciplines has helped me as a competitor, something I did not get to do until later in life when I got my ponies.

Tell us about who you drive, & what you drive!

I compete now at the FEI Advanced Level in Combined Driving with a Pair of Classic American Shetland ponies. Shetland/hackney X. They are 11.2, Al Capony and Bugsy Maloney, "The Flying Gangsters". They are the smallest Equine's competing at this level, and usually are among the top 5 in the marathon! I have two more now, Kimba a mare who was a rescue and adopted from The Kentucky Horse Park. And now a new addition - Tony da Pony who is just coming 5 and learning the ropes.

Who has had the greatest influence on your involvement with driving? Do you have a driving mentor or someone whose expertise you particularly admire?

It's a long list. I have been very fortunate to have trained with many of the best. I started with Larry Poulin and Bill Lower. Joe Yoder got The Gangsters off to a great start when he was at Belle Gray Farm, and was able to continue to work with me in Florida the winter of 2015. I have learned a lot from Suzy Stafford, Thorston Zarembowicz, and Tracey Morgan. Two years ago I brought 3x World Driving Pony Champion Bram Chardon (NED) to the US for the first time as a clinician. At just 22 years old at the time, he was here for 3 weeks and drove my ponies to win the Intermediate Championship at The Hermitage Classic in 2015. We have worked together since and I have been to their beautiful facility near Delft in Holland. More recently because he was at Belle Gray near Middleburg, VA I worked with Marco Freund and made some great progress. Tracey Morgan has become a good friend and someone whose advice and guidance I respect and have grown from. She understands ponies, is an experienced competitor and a judge. She can be tough- which I need.

What is your favorite driving event, & why – cones, marathon, dressage, pleasure driving, other types? What's your favorite place to drive, & why?

I love it all but the marathon is a blast! My ponies love to fly, and it's hard to hold them sometimes. When they see the red flag at the hazard they know what's next and I just let them go. I also like Phase A in a CDE where we get to see places one rarely does. To drive Phase A at the Hermitage along the beautiful black barns with red trim, and to be greeted by thoroughbred weanlings in one field, yearlings in the next and broodmares with foals, was such a special experience. I love driving the most on my farm in Kentucky. We are always improving the trails, my arena, and keep a path mowed and maintained around the exterior of the five separate fields. The hills help build them up quickly and we arrive in Florida very buff for the winter season. My time in Virginia has been a real treat and I wish I could have done more Picnic Drives with the clubs.

What's the funniest thing that has happened to you while driving? Or with horses, for that matter?

My first Live Oak the ponies were sharing a stall. While they were getting braided they escaped and took a grand tour of about 100 acres 1 hour before my dressage. I took the ATV far out into a huge field, and they just stood there, a little surprised at themselves and happy to have me come "rescue" them. It wasn't so funny at the time, but it's a great story. Jeannie Abbot was navigating for me when we were at Little Everglades. After about the third obstacle we kicked into gear and she was blown away by how fast the ponies were going. Unfortunately we can't show the GoPro video, she was quite expressive :) I have another great navigator, David Getz (when I can get him) He does it all, is a vet tech, trainer with hot shot ponies himself, and has the best whistle. And then there is my husband Wayne Humphreys. He has a great sense of direction and memory. It's because of Wayne and his support and love for the sport and ponies we got as far as we did. Thank you Wayne!

What advice do you have for others who are considering joining this discipline?

Invest in good training and focus. And don't be overwhelmed. The first big event I did with Joe Yoder I was so excited and talking away as I was walking the obstacles. I walked them a hundred times, but when we got out there to hazard 1, I was like "Where's A?" But it does get easier. I can remember every route I took in my last event as I go over it in my head now. And I am doing A-F! It's way more fun than crossword puzzles for memory skills. Another word of advice, if it is possible do pairs. It's a wonderful challenge and we need more pony pairs in our sport. Think of it this way, 2 ponies = 1 horse!

What's your happiest driving experience/ memory so far?

Every time I drive my ponies I am happy, even when it's not going perfectly. But finishing Live Oak at Advanced this year with a clean and fast marathon has so far been my proudest moment. I qualified for the 2017 FEI Pony Driving Championships at that event, but decided not to go this time. We still are just beginning to get the hang of it. Nothing ever goes perfectly in Combined Driving, just like in life, so you have to be proud of the parts that go well.

Where would you like to drive, that you haven't yet?

Europe. I am hoping next summer to bring the ponies, or maybe lease a pair in the Netherlands and live, train and compete under the guidance of the Chardon's.

What else is on your personal horsey "bucket list"?

Great question! Now that I have 4 ponies, I am hoping this winter to put them all together in a four in hand and enjoy the view.





In consideration of participating in JRDA events, by driving, riding on a carriage, spectating, or assisting, I hearby, for myself, my spouse, legal representatives, heirs, and/or assigns, RELEASE, WAIVE AND DISCHARGE the James River Driving Association and all landowners from any and all liability to me, my spouse, legal representatives, heirs and/or assigns, for ANY AND ALL loss or damage, and any claim or damage resulting therefrom on account of injury to me or my property, even injury resulting in my death, whether caused by the negligence of those I am releasing or otherwise

This agreement is given in part under the Virginia Equine Activity Liability act (Code of Virginia : 32-6200 et seq.) as it may now provide or be hereafter amended (the "Act"). All terms defined by the Act shall have the same meaning herein, and the Act is hereby incorporated in this Agreement by reference. The participant hereby acknowledges that he has full and complete notice and understanding of the Act and of all the risks inherent in equine activities which may cause, contribute to or result in the death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant's property. This Agreement shall be so construed as to provide to the sponsor/professional and each Landowner the fullest protection of a release, waiver of right to sue and assumption of all risks which is afforded to the sponsor/professional/Landowner by the Act and by general law.

I assume full responsibility for risk of bodily injury or death to myself, or damage to my property, whether due to negligence of those I am releasing or otherwise, while I am on the landowner's property.

I understand that James River Driving Association and its Officers, the Driving Event Competition, Competition judges, officials or organizing committee, or the property owners, accept NO responsibility for accidents, damage, injury, or illness to the equines, owners, riders, drivers, groom(s), passenger(s), attendant(s), spectators, or any persons and property in connection with any event held.
