For clients trailering in with their own horse for a lesson:

- Arrive to open gates and plenty of parking, because you have the space exclusively to yourself! Please bring a groom/helper with you (preferably from your household and not putting further people at risk, but no dogs, unnecessary guests, or auditors).
- Emily will meet you at the ring, with an already tacked-up and warmed-up horse. 3 arenas: dressage arena, marathon obstacles, and cones available.
- Be prepared to harness and hook your horse safely and independently. With use of a mic and headset, Emily will instruct lessons while following social distancing protocols.

For ship-in schooling, \$20/trailer:

- The show facility is available for schooling time, scheduled with Emily in advance. You MUST have an able groom/navigator with you!
- Due to Covid-19 guidelines, there will only be one trailer/visitor at a time. Safety is the primary concern, therefore to qualify for this opportunity, FFDC asks that you take an initial lesson with an FFDC horse & Emily to evaluate the safety and ability of you and your equine partner.
