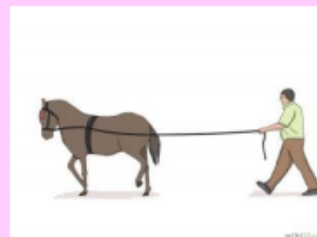
# BVDC Long-lining Clinic

*Open to BVDC members and non-members*

*Long-lining is a wonderful way to introduce the young horse to work in the bridle and a great first step for the potential driving horse. But it is also a good way to fine-tune the skills of the experienced driving horse and to vary their work routine.*



### **Clinic Details:**

- ♦ Individual lessons will be approximately 20-30 minutes in duration.
- ♦ First lesson will begin at 10:00 am.
- ♦ Clinic limited to 6 horses.
- ♦ If bringing your horse, you need to bring an open bridle & surcingle. Anne Rawle will supply whip & reins.
- ♦ Clinic fees:
  - > BVDC Full Member with horse: \$40
  - > BVDC Associate Member with horse: \$45
  - > Non-member with horse: \$50
  - > Auditor: \$15
- ♦ Clinic will be held in an indoor arena (unheated).
- ♦ Bring your own chair & dress warmly.
- ♦ Light breakfast fare and beverages (hot/cold) will be served.
- ♦ Watch for signs directing parking - if wet you will be directed to park near the road instead of up near the indoor.

### **July 24-26**

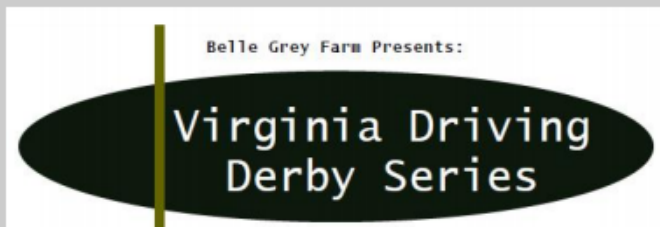

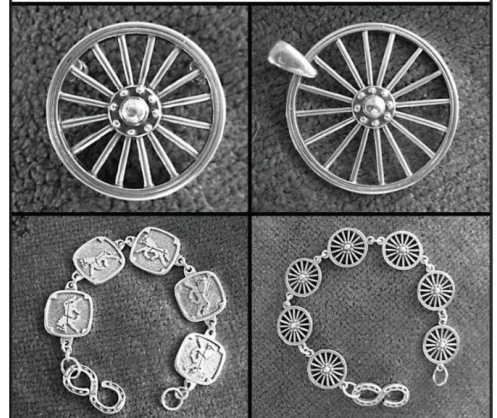

# BVDC Novice Driver Clinic & Turnout Clinic with Lore Homer

At Chapter One Farms, Pedricktown, NJ

**Saturday, March 28th**

*Open to BVDC members and non-members.*

*The popular novice driver clinic plus the new turnout clinic are being offered by long-time club member Lore Homer who is an expert whip, recognized judge and very effective instructor. Many current whips have had an excellent start with Lore in past clinics, learning the basics and acquiring the techniques and confidence to safely work with a horse.*



**Novice Driver Clinic Details:** This clinic is open to new drivers, but some experience is necessary. Auditors are welcome also. You may bring your horse or pony for harness fitting and carriage fitting. You may also bring your horse in hand (halter) or in long lines, if this is where you are with your training. The group will be divided according to horse size to make the environment safer for all. Lore will spend time with each driver and answer any questions the participants may have.

Horses and ponies:

- Must be able to work in a group situation and stand quietly with others
- Must be broke to the cart or carriage
- Harness and carriage must be in good working condition

The Driver:

- Must have and use a whip and gloves
- Must have at least 4 hours of qualified driving training
- Have basic knowledge of harness, hitching and safety factors
- Helmet is required for driver & all passengers.

This clinic is for the inexperienced driver who wants to build some confidence and experience in being with a group of other drivers and being evaluated for appropriate turn-out, correct harnessing, and "way of going" in a low stress environment.

## **Turnout Clinic Details: *NEW this year!***

Wouldn't you like to know how the judge evaluates your turnout? Lore will bring examples of her turnout attire (hats, aprons, etc) plus we will have photo enlargements of turnout examples for Lore to critique and comment on. Participants are welcome to bring along their own turnout attire, harness, or show vehicles as well as photos (at least 5X7 size) of themselves in show turnout for Lore to provide feedback to you.

The clinics will be held inside at Chapter One Farms' indoor arena. For directions go to: [www.chapteronefarms.com/directions](http://www.chapteronefarms.com/directions). Drivers need to bring and use muck buckets. Water is available. Bring a chair! Release form is available at <http://www.bvdc.org/BVDCRelease.pdf>.

# Hoof Problem Protocol

the **HORSE**

TYPE	CLINICAL SIGNS	WHO TO CALL?	IMMEDIATE TREATMENT	ONCE THE VET/FARRIER ARRIVES
<b>ABSCESS</b> 	Acute and generally non-weight-bearing lameness caused by infection within the hoof.	Call the veterinarian first and, if necessary, a farrier.	Keep your horse in a clean, comfortable environment. Placing the foot in a hot water soak with Epsom salts or applying a medicated poultice might help relieve pain.	The veterinarian or farrier will use hoof testers to pinpoint the area of discomfort causing the lameness, then create a small hole to locate and drain the abscess from the sole-wall junction (white line). This will be followed by applying a soak bandage or a medicated poultice. He or she might also administer a tetanus booster.
<b>PUNCTURE WOUND</b> 	Lameness ranging from mild to severe, an observable puncture site in the bottom of the foot, signs of infection, and, possibly, the penetrating object still in place.	Call the veterinarian.	If the offending object, especially a nail, is still in the horse's foot, do not remove it. The veterinarian will want to take a radiograph with the object in place to determine its depth, direction, and what structures might be involved. Restrict your horse's activity, protect the wound to prevent further trauma, and keep him as comfortable as possible—preferably in a clean, deeply bedded stall.	If the wound is not serious, the veterinarian will clean, explore, lavage, debride, and bandage the area as well as administer a tetanus booster and antibiotics if needed. In more complicated cases radiography is necessary to reveal the direction and depth of the puncture and structures involved and to determine next treatment steps.
<b>HOOF CRACK</b> 	A vertical (or, rarely, horizontal) crack at the horse's toe, quarter, heel, or bar.	If there's no blood and your horse shows no signs of discomfort, then call your farrier.	Clean the foot and keep it covered (using a hoof boot or gauze/wrap/duct-tape combo) until the farrier arrives.	Your farrier will need to determine the cause of the crack and respond appropriately. He or she might need to repair the crack to stabilize it, protect the damaged wall, eliminate pain/bleeding, and prevent/or further progression and possible infection.
<b>BRUISE</b> 	A visible bruise on (most commonly) the sole, quarters, toe, or frog, and possible lameness.	Call the farrier or veterinarian.	If you notice a problem immediately, apply cryotherapy (cold therapy) to slow the blood flow and minimize bruising.	Depending on the severity, your veterinarian might prescribe non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medications and recommend special boots, shoes, or pads to prevent further damage.
<b>LAMINITIS</b> 	Reluctance to walk, weight shifting, a "sawhorse" or "pointing" stance, or more time than usual spent lying down. Always consider so-called bruising to be laminitis until proven wrong.	Call the veterinarian and, later, a farrier.	Begin cryotherapy (e.g., standing in cold water or an ice slurry that extends above the fetlock) immediately, restrict your horse's movement, and place him on soft footing/deep bedding.	Your veterinarian might take baseline radiographs, prescribe pain-relief methods, and work with your farrier to stabilize the horse's feet initially.
<b>POSSIBLE FRACTURE</b> 	Sudden lameness (particularly after exertion), increased digital pulse, coffin joint swelling if the joint is involved, among others. Often confused with a bruise.	Call the veterinarian and, later, a farrier.	Get your horse into a clean, deeply bedded stall and restrict his movement.	Veterinarians might use radiographs to confirm a fracture. As fractures often don't show up on radiographs for 3-5 days, MRI and nuclear scintigraphy can be used to confirm foot fractures. Depending on the location/severity, horses require stall rest, therapeutic shoeing, casting, or even surgical repair.
<b>QUICKED/HOT/CLOSE NAIL</b> 	If non-weight-bearing lameness occurs immediately following shoeing. There might be a trace of blood where the nail exits the hoof wall.	Call the farrier or, if severe, a veterinarian.	Do not remove the nail, but restrict your horse's movement and keep him comfortable in a stall.	Once the nail is removed, establish drainage. This might be followed by applying and maintaining a soak bandage or medicated poultice until any infection subsides.
<b>TWISTED SHOE</b> 	A shoe that has not been completely dislodged from the foot	If there are no punctures or abrasions, call your farrier.	Restrict movement.	The farrier will either remove or replace the shoe and repair any hoof wall damage.

## Glen Willow Educational Summer Series 2015

Last year's inaugural summer series at Glen Willow was a great success. There were many happy drivers and equines that participated in the combined tests and the hazard clinic. The summer series was so successful that we are doing it again!

As similar to last year these are schooling shows, so while not ADS sanctioned we will be following their rules for safety. The CT's consist of dressage and cones, with the option to drive an extra dressage test and a second cones course. The first round of each will count toward CT placing, but use the second trip to improve your score or fix mistakes. Drivers who drove two dressage tests wanted immediate feedback from the judge, so they could drive their test over and make improvements. There was time built into schedule to allow for this and most of the shows did not start before 9:45 and were done by 3:00 pm. Start time for shows is dependent on number of entries, but shows will not start before 9:00 am. The shows have training level through intermediate level divisions, with single and pair classes for VSE, ponies and horses. All dressage tests to be driven in a 40 X 80 meter ring.

This year we will have a series championship; the best two scores from the four shows will be averaged together to determine the championship.

Another addition to this year's agenda is the possibility of a very modified marathon course to run in conjunction with one or more of the CT's. It would be a short course with two obstacles maybe driven twice. Still working on details of this and finding the right support crew for volunteers.

Also in the works is another hazard/obstacle clinic, this one is with Janelle Marshall. As an advanced level international competitor Janelle has experience with singles and pairs. Her youthful energy and enthusiasm comes across in her teaching. This clinic will most likely happen at end of July due to calendar conflicts.

There are limited off site stabling options available, the furthest is a 10 minute truck and trailer ride away. Contact me about any stabling needs you might have.

There were some questions regarding the dress code last year, so let me clarify. Out of respect to the judges I think it is nice to present yourself in a clean and tidy manor. Aprons and gloves should be worn and helmets are acceptable and required for those under age 18. Please dress appropriate to the weather conditions, i.e.: rain or extreme heat.

June 27-CT (this date is tentative) please note this is a Saturday  
July 12-CT with Dana Bright as Dressage Judge

I will be emailing an entry form within the next month, I will also have finalized dressage test information and hopefully sorted out my plan with short marathon. For your information the CTs were \$50 last year with an additional \$15 for each extra cones course or dressage test.
